Village Council Meeting Minutes For Monday January 9th 2023 7:00 p.m. 250 S. Maple St. SE Caledonia, MI 49316

Meeting was called to order by President Lindsey at 7:00 p.m.

The Pledge of Allegiance was recited.

Members present were; Soest, Hahn, Miller, Schuler, Niles, Erskine, Lindsey, also present was the Manager. Treasurer Eardley was absent

A letter was provided by Ken Yonker, Kent County Drain Commissioner regarding survey work that will be occurring along county drains.

Moved by Soest, supported by Miller to approve the consent agenda (with the removal of fences under old business) minutes of the December 12th meeting, treasurers report and pay the bills with the addition of a Harmony life insurance and Truck and Trailer Specialties bills. Motion passed unanimously.

Jon Moxey gave an update on Kinsey Street finalization along with other activities including helping with inspections for site plan and occupancy certificates.

Miller reported on Cal Comm. School board will meet next Monday.

President Lindsey reported cancelation of most recent township board meetings.

The manager spoke on recent crime that is not only happening in and around the Caledonia but all over. He announced leadership change at Kent County animal control. MDOT will be hold a public meeting on the M37 rehab on February 1st starting at 4:30 located at the township hall. The manager spoke of the village's manpower shortage continuing with a personnel status change. He reported that two solar panel had arrived for the radar signs and there are hopes that they will be soon installed. The manager reported on winter time activities and equipment status.

A motion by Niles, supported by Schuller to set the 2023 meeting dates as provided by the manager. Motion passed unanimously.

The president presented her recommendation for appointments for 2023 in a resolution, noting that there are still some openings on the Planning Commission that have yet to be filled.
