



A Commitment to Transparency, Accountability and Results

MERS is governed by an independent, elected board that operates without compensation. The MERS Retirement Board serves as the fiduciary of the funds and has oversight responsibilities for the System, in accordance with the state and federal laws that govern municipal retirement and Other Post Employment Benefit (OPEB) programs. MERS is not subject to the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA), yet follows many Department of Labor (DOL) best practices and ERISA guidelines as it relates to compliance and plan administration.



MERS Retirement Board

is responsible for administration of the system with fiduciary responsibility for the investment of assets and oversight.

MERS is the Sole Fiduciary for Your Plan

As the sole fiduciary for all our retirement plans, your employees' interests are our number one priority. Employers can enjoy the peace of mind that comes with knowing that the MERS Retirement Board takes on the fiduciary responsibility and legal liability for:

- Selecting and monitoring investment options used by participants
- Employing in-house legal staff to monitor state and federal laws, and ensuring our programs are in compliance
- Actively maintaining our tax-exempt status with the IRS

Degrees of Fiduciary Responsibility

When it comes to the fiduciary responsibility for your retirement plan, not all plan providers assume the role of sole fiduciary.



Co-Fiduciary Responsibility

When acting as the sole fiduciary — which MERS does for all our retirement plans — the plan provider establishes the plan document, determines the investment options available, and monitors fund performance.

Plan Provider

The plan provider accepts full fiduciary responsibility for the plan.

Many plan providers act as cofiduciaries. The provider offers investment information and makes recommendations. The employer is responsible for selecting and monitoring the performance of the funds.

The plan provider and employer share fiduciary responsibility for the plan.

Employer

Most plan providers act only as a record keeper and leave decisions regarding the plan document, investment options and performance monitoring to the employer.

The employer has unlimited choices under this scenario, but risks being held liable for fiduciary violations.



MERS Defined Contribution Plan and 457 Program

Plan Administration

MERS is more than just another third-party service provider. MERS provides full plan administration for each of our retirement products, including investment management, due diligence, fiduciary responsibility, 1099 processing and more.

Our in-house legal staff actively monitors the qualified tax status for our retirement plans, as well as state and federal laws, ensuring that our plans are in compliance. In addition, we employ an independent internal auditor who reports only to the MERS Retirement Board.

MERS Defined Contribution Plan

The MERS Defined Contribution Plan is a qualified retirement plan under Section 401(a) of the Internal Revenue Code (also known as a governmental money purchase plan). The plan provides each participant with an account to which contributions are made and assets are invested. When an employee retires, their benefit is based on the total amount of money in the account. As a qualified plan, participants are not taxed on employer contributions or earnings until assets are withdrawn.

The IRS sets an <u>annual contribution limit</u> on the total of both employer and employee contributions allowed in any one year. *Per IRS rules, once an employee has elected a contribution level, that contribution level cannot be changed.*

MERS 457 Program

The MERS 457 Program is a 457(b) supplemental savings program for public sector employees designed to help them save for the future above and beyond other retirement plans from their employers. The program offers each employee a self-directed investment account into which a portion of their salary is voluntarily deposited. Employers can choose to allow employees to make pre-tax contributions and/or Roth contributions. The employee decides the level of contributions and how to invest the assets to meet their goals and personal risk tolerance. When an employee leaves employment, any voluntary employee contributions into the 457(b) account will be available to the employee immediately upon terminating (separating) employment. Annual contribution limits can be found at www.mersofmich.com.

Combining Plans to Incentivize Employee Savings

By using the MERS Defined Contribution Plan and 457 Program in tandem, employers can incentivize employee saving through matching contributions while providing employees the added flexibility to adjust their contribution rate at any time.

When making matching contributions, the employer's pre-tax contributions are deposited into the 401(a) portion of an employee's account, while the employee's voluntary pre-tax and/or Roth contributions are deposited into the 457(b) portion of their account. Employers retain the option to apply a vesting schedule to the employer match, which is deposited into the 401(a) portion of the plan.

Participants can track both account balances through a single, consolidated Quarterly Account Statement detailing contributions, investments and growth for all their participant directed accounts, including the MERS Health Care Savings Program and IRA, as applicable.



Vesting

MERS-to-MERS Time

This is a unique provision to MERS Retirement Plans that would allow a municipality to attract experienced and qualified employees who have separated from another MERS employer. Through MERS-to-MERS time, an employee hired at a municipality and who qualifies to participate in the Defined Contribution Plan would accrue service time for meeting vesting and early retirement provisions in a former MERS employer's Defined Benefit Plan.

The MERS Investment Menu

Investment Menu Designed for Successful Outcomes

The MERS Retirement Board and Office of Investments select and monitor the investment menu options. They actively review the fund lineup, investment managers, and index funds available and make changes as needed based on strict criteria.

Our deliberately streamlined investment menu allows participants to make decisions easily and build a fully diversified investment portfolio based on risk tolerance and asset class to reach their retirement income goals.

Fully diversified, professionally managed target-date funds that automatically adjust over time.

The MERS LifePath target date funds provide participants with a simple, effective, all-in-one investment choice. The default investment fund for the MERS Defined Contribution Plan and 457 Program, these target date funds provide diversification across asset types and styles, an asset class mix that adjusts over time, volatility management, research driven active management, and disciplined rebalancing.

The glide path below shows how the mix of stocks and bonds gradually changes over a lifetime. As retirement gets closer, and well beyond that date, the fund gradually adjusts to a more conservative investment mix with a focus on protecting principal while generating income.
